instruments helps build a broad emotional spectrum inside an individual.

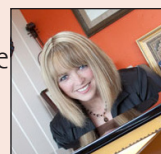

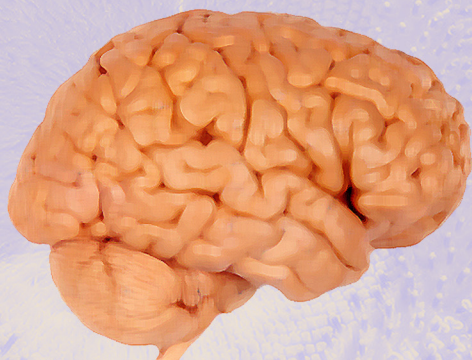

He performed as a teenager during his Army service, joined the U.S. Army Band as a guitar player, touring Europe. With the aid of the GI Bill, he was able to study music at Berklee College of Music, in Boston, MA, earning a bachelor's degree, and has since been living and performing in the Central Coast.

Teaching Philosophy: Glen believes in developing strong fundamental knowledge of theory and technique and encourages the concept of "offensive" rather than "defensive" playing, meaning giving the student real working knowledge of the guitar and music, rather than just strumming and playing simple songs.

'Play Me, I'm Yours' Piano Art Tour

THE PIANOS ARE COMING!

Since Luke Jerram's "Play Me, I'm Yours" art tour went international in 2008, the artist has placed over 400 pianos in cities across the world - all free for the public to play.

The goal of the project is to "disrupt people's negotiation of their city and invite the public to engage with, activate and take ownership of their urban environment," according to Jerram's website, www.streetpianos.com.

Each city commissions the tour to come and install the pianos, which are usually decorated by members of the

community. Every piano displays the words, "Play Me, I'm Yours."

Each city decides how long the pianos will remain installed. After each city culminates its presentation, the pianos are donated to local schools and community groups.

According to Jerram's website, the pianos have now reached over a million people all over the world.

The tour is presently set to come to three cities in 2012: San Juan, Puerto Rico in February, Los Angeles in April, and Salt Lake City in June. Go to www.streetpianos.com to learn how to bring the tour to your city.

Learning Tip

Experiment with different kinds of songs, styles and instruments.

Every time we learn, we form networks in our brain called "neural networks." When we experiment with different songs, styles and instruments that we aren't used to in our normal learning routine, we form new neural networks in our brain. So, by adding variety to how we go about learning we create depth within the neural makeup of our brain, which ultimately allows for a broader depth of learning to take place.

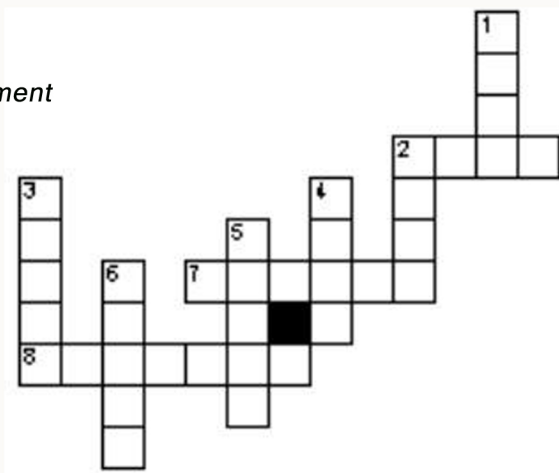

Family Music Fun **Make Your Own Homemade Instruments!**

Rubber Band Guitar: Use a sturdy box with a lid. Cut a circle in the top for the sound hole. Stretch rubber bands, or elastic (eg. hat elastic) around the box and lift the elastic up off the box with pencils on each end to avoid buzzing. Try different lengths and tensions in the elastic to see what different sounds and pitches you can come up with.

Drum: Cut the ends off 2 balloons. Stretch them over 2 large empty coffee containers. Tape the balloon edges, if needed. Find some drum sticks and you're ready to play. Try stretching one balloon more than the other to get two different pitches. For more fun, attach balloons to the coffee lids, tape a pencil in-between the lids that has a string with beads attached, then spin the pencil.
